**Fact:** Three Victorian Cross recipients rest in Greenwood Cemetery in it. It is the only known cemetery in the world to have this honor.

Jim explained most people take these tours as pilgrimage to find relatives lost in each of the wars. Some are amateur historians. He researches points of interest to individual travellers before the tour and tries to incorporate those points as part of the tour.
