Guest Speaker

Don Scott spoke on the Niagara Escarpment. He gave us an overview of the history of the Escarpment, how the

commission was started and showed slides of the geological formations within the 725 kilometers in Ontario. The Bruce Trail is one of many recreational resources found within the Niagara Escarpment in Ontario. The Escarpment is a Canadian Biosphere. Don spoke about development pressures that affect the system such as urban development threatening agriculture, golf courses, water tables and the depletion of natural resources such as forests, mines, fish and aggregates. One of the newest threats is wind power.
