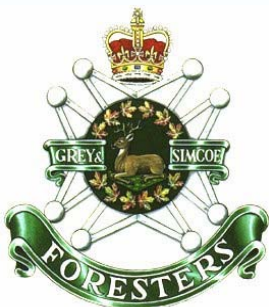

Guest Speaker

Brigadier General Hayter from the Grey & Simcoe Foresters (Militia) spoke about the year of the Veteran - 2005. He provided facts and figures about various wars and campaigns culminating in the 60th Anniversary of WW II.
