PP Bruce Price spoke on one of his passions, the Bruce Trail. Bruce joined the Bruce Trail Club in 1972 and helps keep the 175 km local trails in good order. There are 150 members in the Owen

Sound Chapter. The Bruce Trail is the longest trail in Ontario at 800 km. It has good vistas, forests, meadows, marshes and more to see as it passes through the heartland of Ontario. The trail was started in 1960. Private property as well as Crown land, county land and public land hosts the trail. The Bruce Trail committee is hoping to have all of the trail secure by 2015. That means no part of the trail on private property. There are a few publications such as the Sydenham Hiker and the Bruce Trail Quarterly, which can be purchased for those interested in the trail. Membership to the Bruce Trail Club is \$50 annually.
