The Family History Centres are branches of the Family History Library in Salt Lake City. Resources can be accessed at no charge. Each fall the Owen Sound Centre holds the annual meeting of the Genealogy Society in the Durham arena. At this event participants will learn more about key aspects of genealogy.
