## **CHINA, A REMARKABLE COUNTRY**

PLG Bob Nicol introduced guest speaker Peter Farlinger. Peter moved to the Owen Sound area 12 years ago and has taken 2 trips to China.

In 1980 he traveled from Hong Kong to China by train. At that time it was underdeveloped and clearly under communist control. His most recent trip, this past winter, he saw expressways, shopping centres, cars and traffic and a highly developed sense of free enterprise. One commonality Peter reports from both trips is his impression of the people of China. They are friendly, extremely inquisitive and accommodating. They struggle within difficult conditions to achieve many of the same goals we have in North America such as education for our children and economic success. Peter says that any interest and awareness in the economies of Canada, the United States and Europe has to include China too.

Peter recommends we read "Red China Blues: My Long March from Mao to Now" by Jan Wong.
